The Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation, in partnership with the Department of Education of the Philippines, invites educators, academicians, development practitioners and policymakers to participate in the Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation Information and Communication Technology for Education (ICT4E) Expo to be held on 9-10 June 2010 at the Hilton Hotel in Mactan Island, Cebu, Philippines.

The Expo Secretariat is calling for innovative papers and presentations that address various ICT4E issues of relevance especially to developing economies in Asia-Pacific to be presented at the plenary and parallel sessions.

As the Expo aims to draw out experiences and best practices on ICT4E, other presentation formats such as videodocumentaries, and online interactive presentations, etc. that would interest and encourage maximum interaction are also welcome.

- ICT for Basic Education, Higher Education, and TVET
